## Provision of scholarships to students with the lack of funds

RMUTP provides scholarships to undergraduate students who are in need of financial support. They have awarded scholarships to a total of 2,544 students, with a combined amount of 127,327,800 baht for year 2022. This amount is divided into two categories:

1. Education Loan Fund for Study (2,059 students)  
- A total of 119,935,550 baht is allocated to support these students.
2. Other Types of Scholarships (485 students)  
- An amount of 7,390,250 baht is provided to assist these students.

## Provision of scholarships for students from low and low-middle income countries

RMUTP has provided scholarships to students from Bhutan, totaling 30 scholarships with a combined amount of 1,553,000 baht, and one scholarship to a student from Indonesia, amounting to 35,000 baht. In total, these scholarships amount to 1,588,000 baht. (Bhutan and Indonesia are low and low-middle income countries.)

## University Business Incubation Center has developed community products in Khok Nong Nam model.

RMUTP was the president of the project "RMUTP SANDBOX 2" held at the Community Business Incubation Center (UBI), Khok Nong Nam Model, Muang Ngam, Sao Hai, Saraburi. Over 40 students from the Faculty of Architecture and Design and local entrepreneurs participated in the project.

The project featured community products developed through training and product development during the first phase. This collaboration involved faculty members from the Faculty of Industrial Technology and packaging development from the Faculty of Architecture and Design working together with the local community of Muang Ngam, Sao Hai, Saraburi. In addition, there were lectures on the project's concepts and the development of a self-sustaining economic model for "Khok Nong Nam Mo DeL" by Ms. Wanida Srimen, the village head of Muang Ngam.

This project, promoting and developing culture-based and local wisdom products under "RMUTP SANDBOX 2," is a significant starting point where RMUTP and its students actively engage in community development, aiming to increase the value of local products, contribute to the grassroots economy, and provide sustainable income.
